

The Problem

According to Eurostat data, Romania has the highest rate of the population at risk of poverty or social exclusion, 35.8% - three times larger than the EU champion - the Czech Republic - and over 50% larger than the EU average. Over one in three Romanians are thus at risk of poverty.

- Ongoing Sustainability Project Orchard planting 120 fruit trees for 95 abandoned and disabled children at Steven the Great Special Vocational School

Can a policeman legally search your car if you are stopped for a traffic violation?

A car is your private property and you have recognized and protected rights of privacy in it. Generally, a policeman may not search your car incident to a traffic stop unless 1) you give permission, 2) there is "probable cause" for the search, or 3) he has a warrant signed by a judge. Since the existence of a warrant presupposes that the police know of an illegal situation prior to the stop, it is outside the scope of this article (except as set out below), and I will principally address mainly the first two situations.

If stopped, always be polite and cooperative and produce documents such as driver's license, insurance card, and the like. You will not win any argument with the policeman regarding those.If asked to step out of the car, do so.Comply with reasonable orders so as to avoid making the situation worse by resisting the officer's directives.

The policeman may ask if you consent to a search of your car. The mere question evidences that he does not, at that moment, have a "right" to search the vehicle. To search without your permission, he must have "probable cause," which is an objective reason for believing that there is some illegal matter that can be found in your car. Of course, it the illegal matter is visible to the naked eye - for example, an open alcohol container on the passenger seat - probable cause has been satisfied. Probable cause is never satisfied by a mere "feeling" of the policeman, even if based on decades of law enforcement experience, that "something is wrong." It must be based on objective, quantifiable facts.

If policeman has a good reason to ask for one, he can usually obtain a warrant by phone to a judge. In Las Vegas, for example, there is always a judge who can order blood draws in the event of a suspected drunk driving stop, and who can be reached by phone, even on the middle of the night.

Bottom line: you do not have to consent to a search of your vehicle, and you should understand that a policeman who stops you is not your friend, nor is he interested in "justice." His job is to find illegal activity and you need not, and should not, help him in this endeavor. You have rights, and you should not waive them, because you can always lose those rights by your actions, even if you did not intend to give them up.

This opinion is not to diminish or discredit any arguments made against my chosen profession. Truly I speak for myself and I cannot say that I always get it right. Not at work or in life. I pray to do my best. My commitment to my fellow human is born out of love for people, love for God and a Love for life. God bless you and Stay safe.

One day Mr. D came to me with a white envelope and said "Take care of my kids." His face was calm, confident, and radiated with a joy that words could not describe. He offered his gift with such gratitude as though he were investing in a large business. When I said "thank you", he smiled and left.

This true story happened not that long ago, to this day I often think about it as the perfect meaning for the Together To Help Organization. When I received that envelope, I understood that TTH's role is to connect caring donors with the many children who expect and need someone to care about their needs. The Science Behind Giving



WHY GIVING IS GOOD FOR YOUR HEALTH?

Giving is Good for Your Body. According to Cleveland Clinic Mental Health, studies show that giving can actually boost your physical and mental health. And that People volunteering to raise money for a specific charity claim a series of health benefits associated to giving.

Research states that people who give social support to others have lower blood pressure than people who don't. Supportive interaction with others also helps people recover from coronary-related events. People who give their time to help others through community and organizational involvement have greater self-esteem, less depression and lower stress levels than those who don't.

Longevity- According to one study, people who were 55 and older who volunteered for two or more organizations were 44% less likely to die over a five-year period than those who didn't volunteer.

Feeling Happier- Biologically, giving can create a "warm glow," activating regions in the brain associated with pleasure, connection with other people and trust. There is evidence that, during gift-giving behaviors, humans secrete "feel good" chemicals in our brains, such as serotonin (a mood-mediating chemical), dopamine (a feel-good chemical) and oxytocin (a compassion and bonding chemical). When you look at the functional MRIs of subjects who gave to various charities, scientists have found that giving stimulates the mesolimbic pathway, which is the reward center in the brain .

Reach out to someone in need, so your mental and physical health will thank you!
